Mayor Rex Smith opened with the pledge of allegiance and led with a prayer.

A duly noticed Public Hearing was held in the board room at Saltillo City Hall on Tuesday, August 28, 2018 at 5:30 P.M. to hear from El Toro restaurant to ask for a sign variance located at 1674 Hwy 45.

Present for the hearing were Donald Cullum, Terry Glidewell, Copey Craig Sanders, Malcomb Driskill, Zoning Administrator Brian Grissom, City Clerk Mary Parker, City Attorney Chris Evans, and Juan Leon of El Toro.

Zoning Administrator Brian Grissom explained that El Toro is requesting to put up an 8' x 10' two-sided monument sign with a total maximum height of 15'. The sign would be no higher than the adjacent Veterinary Clinic sign, which is clearly readable from Hwy 45. This type of new sign could only be allowed by way of a variance from the board to be voted on at a later date.

Mayor Smith asked if there was anyone present who desired to be heard either in favor of or against the requested variance and no one responded. Hearing no response, the public hearing was then concluded.
