On the motion of Scottie Clark, seconded by Craig Sanders, and by an affirmative vote of all present to approve the claims docket 66382 – 66488.

RE: A6 BROWN BAG REQUEST

On the motion of Sonya Witcher, seconded by Terry Glidewell, and an affirmative vote of Glidewell, Sanders, and Witcher, with Scottie Clark voting nay, to extend the A6 brown bag special request allowance for an additional nine (9) months with the following requirements:

- 1. Wine or liquor cannot be kept or stored on the premises at any time.
- 2. The owners or employees cannot handle or help to serve any of the wine or liquor.
- 3. The "brown bagging" shall be allowed to take place on Thursday through Saturday from 5:00 PM until 11:00 PM.

- 4. The premises will need to provide adequate security and will need to verify that no one under 21 is allowed to drink alcohol of any type.
- 5. The premises will need to verify that no one over-serves themselves or obviously consumes too much alcohol, within reason. This will be a subjective, common-sense standard.
- 6. The owners will provide sealable bags so that those leaving the premises with unconsumed containers of alcohol can place said containers in such a bag prior to leaving. The owners will notify the patrons of this requirement.
- 7. The premises will need to have adequate liability insurance and will need to agree to indemnify the city from any claims or liability.
- 8. The premises will need to advise patrons that, upon leaving with unconsumed wine or liquor, they will need to keep the bag and bottle sealed and stored outside the passenger compartment of their vehicle, such as in the trunk of a car, etc.

As with the previous allowance, the board reserves the right to review, alter or amend this finding as circumstances may dictate at the board's discretion.

RE: INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH LEE CO NARCOTICS

On the motion of Craig Sanders, seconded by Scottie Clark, and by an affirmative vote of all present to enter into an interlocal agreement with the North MS Narcotics Unit. The mayor and police chief are hereby given the authority to execute the contract and any other such documents as may be necessary.

RE: DEUNDRA POOLE

On the motion of Craig Sanders, seconded by Scottie Clark and by an affirmative vote of all present to hire Deundra Poole as a full-time police officer and to enter into a contract with Lee County schools for Poole to serve as an SRO in which the schools would pay ½ of his salary and benefits. This hire is contingent upon the contract with Lee County Schools being officially offered to the city and also that Poole understands that he must attend and successfully complete the next available full-time law enforcement academy in order to remain as an officer with the City. He will start out at \$14.28 per hour until his completion of the academy.

RE: JORDAN MANN

On the motion of Scottie Clark, seconded by Craig Sanders, and by an affirmative vote of all present to hire Jordan Mann as a full-time police officer with a salary of \$15.30 per hour and all benefits due a full-time officer. The effective date will be Monday, August 16, 2021.

RE: POLICE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY UPDATE

Chief McKinney informed the board that the department had been very busy during the month of July. Several calls concerning domestic violence, drug arrests and citations had occurred during the month. He said the department was moving forward. No action taken.

RE: ENGINEERING AGREEMENT

On the motion of Craig Sanders, seconded by Terry Glidewell, and by an affirmative vote of all present to engage ESI to do consulting work in the old part of the town to include video inspection and clearing of the sewer lines as well as lift stations. Once the said video inspection has been completed, ESI will then consult further with the city on which, if any, projects need to occur or take priority in order to properly maintain the sewer infrastructure and to lower I & I. The board considers this agreement to be for professional services and, therefore, competitive bids or quotes are not required under state purchasing laws.

RE: ENGINEERING FOR METERS

Dustin Dabbs spoke to the board concerning engineering specs and proposed engineering agreement for auto-read water meters.

RE: ON-CALL PAY

On the motion of Scottie Clark, seconded by Craig Sanders, and by an affirmative vote of all present to approve eight (8) hours of additional pay per employee, at their regular pay rate, during the week in which they are on-call for the water and sewer department. One employee will be on-call each week. In order to be eligible for the pay, they must be available and in the general geographical area so as to allow for a reasonably quick response time when called. This would be paid at their regular pay, but if called in to work then that would be paid at time and half if the hours exceed 40 hours for that week. The week will run Wednesday morning to Wednesday morning to coincide with the payroll. The justification for this extra pay, which was cleared through the city auditors, will be that the employee will incur extra duties such as to be on 24 hour call and must stay in the general area with the ability to respond quickly in case of an emergency during the week in which they are on call.

RE: GPS UPDATE EQUIPMEMT

On the motion of Craig Sanders, seconded by Sonya Witcher, and by an affirmative vote of all present to approve purchase of GPS equipment to use to assist to document and save the location of city water and sewer lines. The purchase will be made from NEI for \$15,576.16, the lowest and best bid. A second quote was also received from Allan for \$16,870.00.

RE: PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

The city will clean the property, if the owners fail to do so, and assess the property for the costs as the law provides. The property was duly noticed for a hearing pursuant to state law.

On the motion of Craig Sanders, seconded by Sonya Witcher, and by an affirmative vote of all present to find the property located at 433 S Third to be a menace to the health, safety and welfare per MS Code 21-19-11. Brian Grissom is to further inspect the property and discuss same with the owners and to report back to the mayor and board at the next regular board meeting.
